Lisa Pilbeam from Etchingham, E. Sussex, is the front runner in three SEEL rankings after consecutive wins at South of England, Nurstead and Borde Hill on her eight-year-old mare Cullawn Celtic Queen ('Lady') and in one with her six-year-old full sister Cullawn Holly following a Berkshire College novice win & Brightling 2nd. In their first intermediate run in Norfolk, Lisa & Lady were 2nd.

Lisa, who recently turned 21, bought the mares in Ireland from breeder Shane Foley, along with five-year-old gelding Cullawn Celtic King. She has 10 horses of her own in the yard she runs, and although most are for sale, Lisa plans to keep Lady and breed from her when the mare retires. For now she is aiming Lady for a three-day-event this year and Holly for the PAVO 6-year-old Breeding Championships in October.

Nurturing this talent is her former eventer mother Tina and her father Mick, plus dressage trainer Liz West. Such promise deserves to attract owners and sponsors.

Lisa says, 'I really love doing it and its fun. It's nice to win but I would pull out if the ground was hard and I needed to save Lady's legs. She's not fussed about the going but doesn't like it sticky so I was surprised at how well she went at Borde Hill.'
